Provide 'high quality' PE teaching/coaching for 2 hours per week through 30 weeks of the academic year.

To provide access to 7 central training opportunities working in partnership with local sports clubs and national governing bodies.

To organise and deliver 1 bespoke training opportunity per school within the sports partnership.

To ensure all schools receive YST membership and are made aware of the resources and discounts they can access.

To chair the Primary PE Forum, organising 3 meetings per year.

To design, produce and distribute 3 newsletters per year

To produce and continuously update a partnership website. Schools will be able to create a link from their own sites to the GDFT Sport Partnership site.

To provide training to Year 2 students to run activities and games for lower key stage playground and Year 5/6 students for the upper key stage playground. Support is given to the midday supervisor's on how to implement the play leader structure and positive play. Regular visits and support from your secondary PE link.

Training to be organised and delivered to up skill KS1 staff to develop their subject knowledge and confidence to delivery Multi Skills practical lessons.

Support and advice given to schools to meet the accreditation criteria for the School Games Mark.

Support to set up a full programme of competitions for each individual school. Includes resources and templates for ease of use. Train Primary Young Leaders to officiate, manage and deliver these events.

Provide at least 1 Inter Festival per year group in response to cluster needs to be delivered on either a school or club site.

Provide free resources to support the delivery of high quality teaching and learning.

Stanground Academy will provide leaders to support the delivery of your school's sports day, competitions, events etc.

Through the GDFT sports provision, each school will receive a half term block of swimming for year 6 students led by a fully qualified level 2 swim teacher and a life guard.
